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- Mayor and Village Board
- Administration, including tax collection
- Water
- Park maintenance and other labor, as needed
- ▶ Snow removal of Village office, church, fire department

- Zoning board
- Agreements with Mannsville-Manor Volunteer Fire Department, the South Jefferson School District (recreation) and the Mannsville Free Library

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### What will happen to services if the Village dissolves?

- We need to determine what happens to services:
  - Do they continue?
  - If so, who provides the service?
  - Who pays for the service?
- ▶ What happens to Village staff?
- What happens to Village buildings and other assets?

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#### Dissolution Plan: Elected Representatives

- Mayor and Board positions eliminated
- Former Village to be governed by the Town
- ▶ Estimated savings: \$4,600

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### Dissolution Plan: Administrative Staff

- Town will be responsible for administrative duties formerly performed by the village clerk and deputy clerk.
- ▶ Town may need additional staff to cover larger workload.
- The Plan will eliminate the village clerk position and provide for the transfer of the village deputy clerk.
- Some Village expenditures for staff transfer to the Town. Estimated savings (\$18,000).

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#### Dissolution Plan: Street Lighting

- ▶ The Town will create a special district for street lights in the former Village of Mannsville.
- The estimated cost of this service would be approximately \$0.6 per \$1,000 of assessed value.

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#### Dissolution Plan: Buildings and Equipment

- Buildings owned by the Village would transfer to the Town upon dissolution. The Town, however, does not need the Village office, garage or equipment.
- Office: The Board is exploring the feasibility of transferring the building to the library.
- Garage: The Village could consider selling the garage to the church or an adjacent neighbor.
- Public Works Equipment: could be sold prior to dissolution.
- The park, water filtration plant and water tower would transfer to the Town.

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#### Dissolution Plan: Public Works

- ▶ The Town would provide the following services:
  - Plow, sand and sweep the streets (as it does currently)
  - Maintain the Village Park
  - ▶ Collect storm damage debris
- ▶ The Town would not provide the following services:
- ▶ Plow the church, museum, library or fire department
- ▶ Hang Christmas lights
- Pick up leaves
- ▶ Clean and flush fire hydrants (but not remove snow)
- ▶ The Town would not hire additional staff.
- Potential savings that could result from eliminating the position of the DPW laborer is approximately \$15,000.

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#### Dissolution Plan: Water

- The town would create a special taxing district for all Village of Mannsville water users and continue to operate it as a stand-alone system.
- The \$1.3 million water debt would remain with the water district and continue to be paid for by former village residents
- If the village dissolved, the town board would have the discretion to change the water rates. However, the rates cannot be increased beyond the point of sustaining the water system.

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### Dissolution Plan: Other Elements

#### Library

 The library would continue to operate independently. It may, however, need additional revenue to cover the cost of owning the building.

#### Recreation

- The Town would provide funding to the School District.
- The town would issue building permits and the town zoning board would cover the former Village.
- Estimated savings that could result from elimination the Village zoning board: \$600.

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### Mannsville Plan: Other Elements(2)

- ▶ Liabilities: none identified
- Debts: water debt stays with water users; if voters choose to dissolve, Village Hall debt will be paid off prior to dissolution
- Water fund balance: will transfer to the new Town water district
- Laws and ordinances: to remain in effect for up to two years, unless no longer applicable or amended by the Town. The Town could then adopt former Village laws as Town

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#### **Opportunities for Shared Services**

- If the Village does not dissolve, there may be opportunities for collaboration with the Town, including:
  - ▶ Some aspects of Village administration
  - > Zoning Board and code enforcement

- Town Outside Village: \$146
