
Baseline Component


- Documenting "what exists" today in the region's local government units financially, operationally and administratively

• Explore a range of potential options for enhancing efficiency, improving competitiveness, rationalizing service delivery frameworks, streamlining processes, reducing costs










Changes in Spending by Level of Government 2002 to 2012
