Project Overview


- Provide information to the Steering Committee and Victor residents regarding the current state of Victor's public safety & emergency services and will provide recommendations for potential changes.
- Project Started in March of 2016
- Baseline Phase is essentially complete
 - Interviews
 - Survey of Residents
 - Information Gathering and Analysis
 - Report on existing situation
- Options Phase is next




Survey Results

- 400 households responded to the survey, representing over 1114 people, which was approximately 7% of town households and 8% of the town's population.
- 22.6% of the responders had households with residents aged 65+, a higher rate than the overall 65+ population in the Town of Victor (16.6%).
- 22.4% of the responders had households with children under the age of 18, less than 26.1% overall in the Town of Victor.
- Those who have lived in Victor 10 or more years were overrepresented, submitting 71.1% of the responses, compared to the overall town rate of 31.6%
- A non-representative, convenience sample



























It is acceptable for Victor Farmington Ambulance to bill for services that don't involve transport to the hospital .



Victor Farmington Volunteer Ambulance

- Covers both Victor and Farmington with paramedic ambulances
- About 8 full time and 25 part time employees with around 20 volunteers
- 4 ambulances and 2 support vehicles
- Operating budget of about \$1.25 million with less than 2% from taxes
- Slightly more than 3 calls per day on average in Victor









Fishers Fire District


- Serves western portion of town
- Separately elected fire commission governs district
- 16 paid firefighters (4 on duty) and about 9 volunteers
- 2 stations
- 2 engines, 1 quint, a heavy rescue and support vehicles
- About \$3.7 million budget in 2016 including a \$1.1 in capital fund expenses
- About \$2.6 million in property tax levy with rate of \$2.077 per thousand TAV




Levy, Wages and Wage Share of Tax Levy (Inflation Adjusted, in millions)


















Victor Fire Department

- Serves Village of Victor and the Victor Fire Protection District in the eastern portion of the town
- Department of the village but a sizeable portion (74%) comes from the town
- About 45 volunteers
- 2 engines, 1 quint, 1 heavy rescue and support vehicles
- Total budget is about \$660,000
- Both village and town raise \$0.912 per thousand TAV



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Ontario County Sheriff's Office

- Primary law enforcement responder for most of Ontario, including Victor
- Elected Sheriff directs the operations with some oversight from Board of Supervisors
- 67 sworn employees
- Town generally has a deputy assigned to its zone
- Eastview Mall has a contract for dedicated staff
- Also handles all 911 and public safety dispatching with 36 full time employees
- Total budget is \$11.9 million for law enforcement and \$4.2 for communications


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New York State Police

- Work side by side with OCSO





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Key Findings (1 of 3)

- The public is generally satisfied with their public safety system, but they see room for improvement
- Fire tax rate in FFD is going up and remaining level in rest of Victor.
- Taxable assessed value is growing, particularly in FFD.
- Declining volunteerism at FFD and VFVA has led to increase in paid staff.
- VFD has been able to maintain constant level of volunteers.
- Fire protection is well rated by Insurance Service Organization



Key Findings (2 of 3)

- Serious property crime in Victor is relatively high compared to Ontario County, but Victor has little violent crime.
- An EMS resource responds to high priority events in eight minutes or less 78% of the time.
 - The VFVA responds to high priority events in eight minutes or less 72% of the time in the Victor Fire service area and 31 % of the time in the Fishers Fire service area.
- Older residents use the ambulance more frequently than the general population.
- Both fire departments are able to get a resource on the scene of calls in eight minutes or less 79% of the time.



Key Findings (3 of 3)

- The call records kept by the OCSO only record the first fire unit that arrives on scene. This prevents an analysis of when adequate resources, such as engines or ladder trucks, for fire suppression arrive on the scene.
- The location of the fire stations is good for the majority of events in Victor.
- The fire departments and VFVA have adequate funding and an appropriate plan to maintain the necessary equipment to perform their tasks.
- Substantial law enforcement resources patrol Victor and provide a prompt response.
